ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY -3 JULY

Today is the 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time and the day that the Australian Bishops and our National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council have invited us to celebrate Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday. Our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics number over 130,000 and are growing strongly.

Today we acknowledge that God has been walking with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, making His Presence known through a continuous living culture over many thousands of years.

We pray in thanksgiving for these ancient peoples who have enriched and sustained our continent over all that time. We praise God for the people who nurtured that land here in our Parish that we call home.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION

In the event of an emergency please follow directions of the Parish Priest, reader or commentator who shall act as the Chief Warden and take control of the emergency response. The collectors shall assist as wardens.

- Proceed to the designated assembly area at the western end of the car park near the Cardiin College entrance and await further instructions from the Chief Warden or emergency services;
- Do not re-enter any buildings until advised by the Chief Warden or emergency services.

(Current from 29/06/22)




A number of issues relating to COVID-19 have been clarified by the Archbishop. They are as follows:

- No density limits for places of worship; churches can return to full capacity.
- QR codes or sign-ins are no longer required.
- · Masks are highly recommended.
- COVID marshals are no longer required except for events covered by a COVID management plan (ie more than 1000 people)

The following activities may resume:

- · Procession of gifts
- Collections (please be mindful to minimise contact when passing)
- · Children's Liturgy of the Word
- After Mass gatherings and Parish meetings.

Carry no purse, no haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the road.

'Whatever house you go into, let your first words be, "Peace to this house!" And if a man of peace lives there, your peace will go and rest on him; if not, it will come back to you. Stay in the same house, taking what food and drink they have to offer, for the labourer deserves his wages; do not move from house to house.

'Whenever you go into a town where they make you welcome, eat what is set before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and say, "The kingdom of God is very near to you." But whenever you enter a town and they do not make you welcome, go out into its streets and say, "We wipe off the very dust of your town that clings to our feet, and leave it with you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is very near." I tell you, on that day it will not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.'

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. 'Lord,' they said 'even the devils submit to us when we use your name.' He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven. Yes, I have given you power to tread underfoot serpents and scorpions and the whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your names are written in heaven.'

SLEEPING LIKE A BABY

I love watching babies at church. I suppose I shouldn't admit that. It might sound as if I'm confessing to being distracted and not paying attention. But how can you not pay attention to a newborn - yawning, scrunching her little nose up, or trying to jam a fist into his mouth? And when they're a bit older it's fun to watch them look around from their perch in Mum or Dad's arms, taking in the lights and colours and strange people, their eyes wide with curiosity. My favourites are the ones who are totally collapsed into their parent's shoulder so we get to see their sweet sleeping face so full of contentment. As the parents move up to Communion or sway to the music (holding a baby gives you a license to sway in church), the child's every need is met and the little one is content and satisfied and living in the now.

That's a state we can spend the rest of our lives trying to recapture. In fact the reading this week from Isaiah proclaims a promise from God that those who are faithful will be comforted, fed, carried in God's arms, and filled with joy so that we can collapse, like contented newborns, into God's care.

Yes, I love watching babies at church, and after hearing Isaiah describe God's promises, I know that this pastime isn't a distraction, it's a flesh-and-blood meditation on God's total love for each and every person – even me.

The Commissioning: There is a harvest to be gathered for the Christian cause. You are challenged to be among those who gather the harvest. As harvesters, we will know when to speak and when to listen. We will know those to approach and those to avoid. We will know the times of opportunity and the inopportune times. We will know the scriptures that are appropriate and those that are not helpful. We will be ready to work practically and pray carefully. Remember the words of Jesus: "There is a large harvest but few workers to gather it in". GPBS eNews
