

DID YOU KNOW?

- Caesarea Philippi is north of the region of Galilee. It was given to Herod the Great by Augustus Caesar and Herod built a white stone temple there and dedicated it to his patron. After Herod's death it passed into the hands of his son, Philip, who built his capital here thus the name, Caesarea Philippi.
- The great stone temple built by Herod was at a natural spring which is the source of the Jordan River. The temple was dedicated to the Roman god of nature, Pan. The cave of Pan is housed in a high natural edifice of rock and it was here that Jesus reputedly told Peter, that he, too, would be a rock on which the Church is built not dedicated to a pagan god but to the one true God.


SYMBOLS AND IMAGES

Keys are a symbol of authority, Jesus says to Peter, "I will give you the keys to the kingdom of heaven." Jesus entrusts his authority to Peter, and this to successive Popes and to the Church. This authority must always be used with wisdom and compassion and with it comes great responsibility, The crossed keys are part of the emblem of the papacy.

'Simon son of Jonah, you are a happy man! Because it was not flesh and blood that revealed this to you but my Father in heaven. So I now say to you: You are Peter and on this rock I will build my Church.

And the gates of the underworld can never hold out against it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven: whatever you bind on earth shall be considered bound in heaven; whatever you loose on earth shall be considered loosed in heaven.' Then he gave the disciples strict orders not to tell anyone that he was the Christ.



A PEG IN A SURE SPOT (Matthew 16: 13 - 20)

One day soon, Peter will deny he ever knew Jesus. But at this moment, he's chosen to be the foundation upon which the future church will rest. Peter, in a sure spot? He was a nail driven into spackle! Is Jesus being ironic when he calls him a rock? In just a few more verses (see vs. 23), Jesus will call Peter the devil.

Jesus is Lord - but also a realist. Human nature is soft, like the flesh that contains it, and there truly is no better choice among the Twelve than Peter. From this impulsive, unschooled, self-preserving fisherman, God will raise up the rafters of a church that will see twenty centuries more. Not because Peter is great, but because God is. Not much can be built on flesh, as frail and uncertain as human beings are. But through the Spirit which gives the church its breath, the reign of God keeps on coming, on earth as it is in heaven.

WHAT'S MY LINE?

When Jesus arrived in the villages of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "What are people saying about who the Son of Man is?" They replied, "Some think he is John the Baptiser, some say Elijah, some Jeremiah or one of the other prophets". He pressed them, "And how about you? Who do you say I am?" Simon Peter said, "You're the Christ, the Messiah, the Son of the living God". (Matthew 16: 13 - 16)


Back in the 1950s there was a popular TV quiz show called What's My

Line? Four celebrity panellists would each ask questions until they received a "no" answer from a contestant. They were trying to guess the contestant's unusual occupation. The contestant would receive cash for each question that could be answered with a "no". Each show also featured a celebrity whose identity the panel had to guess while blindfolded. It wasn't a very sophisticated show, but audiences found it entertaining.

Jesus seems to be playing a similar game with the disciples. Until Peter spoke, they all gave the answers that they were hearing from the crowds—good and logical answers, but wrong nevertheless. Peter shouts out the right answer. Jesus is "The Christ, the Son of the living God". For that answer he is given the prize, the honour of being the rock upon which the church would be built.

The disciples heard this and were told by Jesus not to tell anyone that he was the Christ. We hear the same message today. But the roles have changed. We are to preach to all who will hear that Jesus is the Christ.
